



2017 ALL IN Player's Championship Program Guide

How to Purchase an Auction Spot

Auction spots are sold on a first-come, first-served basis. A spot is sold for \$12,500 (Includes all costs listed) or \$10,500 (\$2,000 reduction) if spot purchaser decides to train and house bull with trainer not provided by ALL IN Program. Spots must be purchased through the EG office or by faxing or mailing in the Purchase Agreement to the EG office with a credit card or check. The applications will be processed in the order they are received. After one hundred (100) spots are sold, all other applications will be returned.

An auction spot ensures the right to bid on a draft position at the 2017 ALL IN Player's Championship Draft Auction held on During ABBI Finals Week at the South Point Casino. A draft position will dictate when the buyer (contractor) will be able to pick their bull.

HOW THE AUCTION WORKS

Draft positions will be sold from 1 to 100. Each draft position will start off with a minimum bid of \$500 and the following sale rules will apply:

- Prior to receiving bull Purchase Agreement, payment for draft spot must be made by cash, check, debit, Visa, or MasterCard or by other means as announced by the auctioneer before the sale. A valid driver's license may be required. Buyer shall pay any and all applicable taxes unless exempted by law. Payment may be made during the sale or within 30 minutes after auction ends, unless other arrangements have been made in advance.
- **The Purchase Agreement must be signed and initial payment must be paid before participating in the 2017 ALL IN Player's Championship Draft Auction.**
- A bid by any person shall be conclusive proof that the person has made himself/herself acquainted with these conditions of sale and has agreed to be bound by them
- The buyer shall be the highest bidder. In case of dispute between two bidders, the auctioneer may reopen the bidding between the highest bidders only, until property is sold.
- When the Auctioneer says "SOLD," the bull Purchase Agreement shall pass to the highest bidder, who assumes full risk and responsibility.
- ALL SALES ARE FINAL.
- The buyer of each draft position will announce their bull pick immediately after their winning bid. The last draft pick may receive the last bull available.

AUCTION GUIDELINES

INSURANCE

Contractors are encouraged to purchase mortality insurance as mortality insurance is not provided on these bulls.

PAYMENT FOR SPOT

Payment in full is due at the time of the Draft.

Once the season is complete, bull owners have the following options:

- If bull is with The Jaynes Gang training, owner may withdraw bull from the training program and relocate bull.
- Owner must make arrangements with the The Jaynes Gang trainer to have the animal off trainer's property at the end of the season.
- There is no penalty for withdrawing from program once the season is complete.
- Owners who withdraw their bulls once the season is complete are still eligible for legacy rights in the next auction. Additionally, bulls will be eligible for future rider events approved by ALL IN program.
- Make arrangements with the trainer to continue services for the ALL IN bulls.

Transfer of bull:

- The bull may be sold and transferred to a new owner.
- Once a new owner is appointed, all Legacy rights will remain with original owners. The rights to enter future rider events will be transferred to owners of bulls at time of rider events.
- Transfer of animal will be the same procedure and fees as a standard ABBI Registered animal.
- Enter bull in Program Sale.
- ALL IN Program will showcase 'program' animals by providing a sale outlet in which owners may place their bulls.

EVENT GUIDELINES & RULES

OVERVIEW

A random draw for the buck order will be completed in the Bucking Bull Games office prior to all, ALL IN Player's Championship events. At the event, the animals will be loaded and bucked by event employees in the order they were drawn. The bulls will be bucked for 4 (four) seconds using a Bucking Bull Games approved dummy. The dummy will be applied by designated contract labor at each event. All of the bulls will be flanked by a professional or designated flank person.

The bulls will be judged by a team of 4-6 judges. This score will be used to determine the official event placing. While all bull owners are encouraged to attend the events, the owner will not be responsible for any duties pertaining to the competition of their animal(s) in the ALL IN Player's Championship events.

Bucking Bull Games will be the sole promoters of all, ALL IN Players Championship events.

Onsite event handling/care:

- All animals will be handled and cared for by program professionals or professional designated by current owner of bull.
- Housing hours:

Event bull housing hours will be set for owners to observe their animals.

Only program professionals shall be allowed in bull housing outside of the set housing hours. At each event there will be a time set for owners to come visit the bull housing area.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

- All bulls must be specific to the program.
- All bulls competing in the Futurity will be registered with the ABBI.
- All bulls will have at least one DNA verified parent.

AGE REQUIREMENTS

All bulls will be born on or between January 1 and December 31, two years prior to the year of competition. EXAMPLE: 2016 calves (calves born on or between January 1 and December 31, 2015) are eligible to compete in 2018.

ANIMAL VERIFICATION / IDENTIFICATION

Bulls will be branded (fire or freeze) with a permanent legible ID number and have an EID tag in place.

Bull calves eligible for 2018 ALL IN Player's Championship are required to be Bucking Bull Games Certified.

ENTRIES

- Entries will be taken through the Bucking Bull Games office depending on the designated futurity events. Event payments will be due prior to the event.

Methods of entry: Online with credit card payment; Fax with credit card payment, US Mail with personal checks, cashier's check, money order, or credit card. Mailed entries and mailed payments must be in the office by the due date and time posted.

- After the posted due date entry the event fee may be collected with a penalty of \$250.

ENTRY FEES*

ALL IN Player's Championship Draft Events- *not included in initial fees*

Regular Season Champions Class = \$1,500

Regular Season Underdog Class = \$1,000

Finals = \$1,000

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS:

All bulls competing must have the required record of a negative TB test and a negative Brucellosis test within the same calendar year and prior to the competition date.

TESTING

Bucking Bull Games reserves the right to collect samples including, but not limited to, tissue and/or fluids from bulls for any reason deemed necessary, specific or otherwise.

PAYOUT

The payout is expressly and strictly contingent upon ALL IN Player's Championship Draft receiving 100 paid and valid entries. If such entries are not received in an acceptable fashion by ALL IN, ALL IN hereby expressly reserves the right to adjust the payout accordingly in its sole and unfettered discretion.

DUMMIES

All bulls competing in an ALL IN Player's Championship produced or sanctioned Futurity will be bucked using a Bucking Bull Games approved dummy.

COMPETITION FORMAT

At all Futurity events, bulls will be bucked for four (4) seconds.

JUDGING GUIDELINES

All bulls will be judged using the 4-6 judge system. All judges will be hired by Bucking Bull Games.

ELECTRICAL DEVICES & FOREIGN OBJECTS

Any and all electrical devices used to stimulate the animal will not be allowed for use inside the bucking chute. Foreign objects in flank will not be allowed.

HORNS

All competing Futurity bulls will have their horns tipped (broken or loose horns are excluded from this rule) prior to arriving for the event and be determined to be the size of a 50 cent piece.

DRAW/CHUTE POSITION

Bucking order will be determined by random draw. Chute delivery will be determined by the on-site trainer/flank man to give the bull the best opportunity.

TIE BREAKERS

There will be no tie breakers employed at the Futurities, except to break a tie for first place. The tie breaker method detailed in EG's Bucking Bull Games Rule Book will be used if it is necessary to break a tie to designate a champion. The tie breaker will be determined by the single highest score of any one judge.

PERSONNEL

At all Futurities, gate men, arena help and production labor will be provided by the Futurity producer. Only these designated individuals will be permitted to conduct their specific tasks.

EVENT GROUND RULES

Specific ground rules may exist for a sanctioned Futurity and will be posted prior to event.

EVENT RESULTS

Event results are unofficial, and subject to change, until audited by the Bucking Bull Games office. Official audited results are typically posted the week following the event.
